



How to paint a Jar Set

SUPPLIES

- Jars
- Paint & Brushes
- Varnish of your choice
- Decorative Tape
- Ribbon, Jute String & Embellishments
- Glue Gun & Glue
- Sandpaper
- Damp Paper Towel



A fun part to the project is picking out your supplies! Feel free to look through everything we have and pick exactly what you'd like!



Change up the paint and embellishments to make it your design!

Once you have everything, make sure your jars are clean. Then start painting with your chalk paint. Turn the jars upside down to finish up and let them dry. (Figures 1 & 2) You'll want to put two coats of paint on the jars. You can move on to the next steps or if you'd like or you can use a heat gun to finish the drying process. When the paint is dry, take a small piece of sandpaper and sand areas where you would like to give the glass a worn look. (Figure 3)

Next, you take the ribbon you've chosen and cut it to fit the ring part of the lid. It needs to be long enough that the ends will touch and completely fit the entire lid. You'll run the hot glue on the lid and glue the ribbon on. It's helpful to do this in small segments so the glue stays hot.



(Figure 4) If the ribbon doesn't fit the entire width of the lid you can also add a smaller ribbon or jute string to add to the look you want. (Figure 5) The final step is to put your embellishments on. You can hot glue them or tie them on, whatever is required. (Figure 6) You now have a great set of jars that you can use for just about anything!
